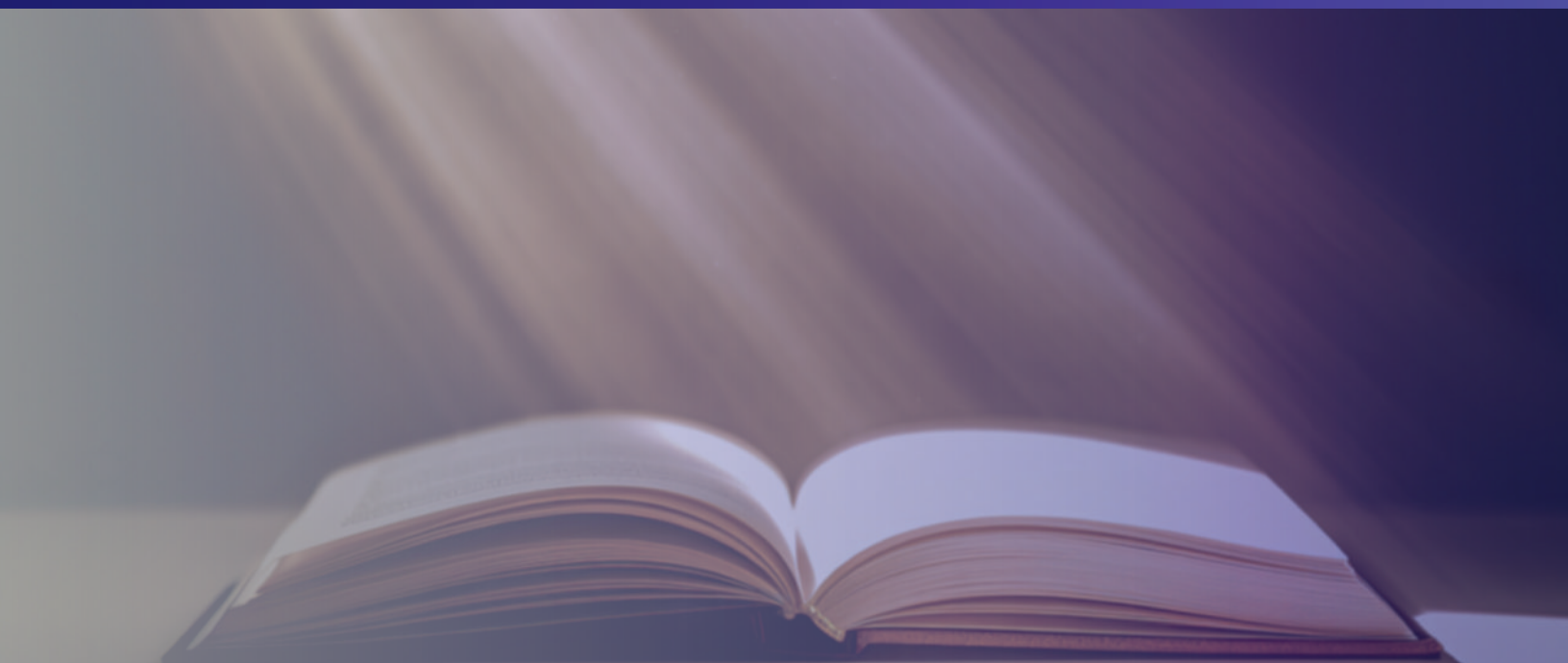

Greetings! We proudly present the 2025 Annual Academic Report of Arihanta Institute with deep gratitude.

At Arihanta Institute, we continue to advance our founding vision of making Jain wisdom accessible worldwide. In less than four years, we have 12 MA-EJS (MA in Engaged Jain Studies) students, 123 MA-EJS course enrollments, over 70 short courses, students from 25 countries, and over 1,700 short-course enrollments globally. These milestones reflect the growing recognition that Jain Studies speaks directly to today's ethical and ecological challenges.

We are truly grateful for the steadfast support of our donors, Board members, students, and community, along with the dedication of our faculty, executive team, volunteers and partners. Remarkably, the academic work highlighted in this report has been delivered by our academic team of just three faculty members — their scholarship and commitment continue to shape our programs in extraordinary ways.

In 2025, with a transformative \$1 million gift from Drs. Jasvant and Meera Modi and Dr. Namrata Patel, we established the Tirthankara Śreyāṃśanātha Endowed Professorship in Vegan and Animal Advocacy Studies. Professor Jonathan Dickstein holds this endowed professorship. We also gratefully acknowledge the Uberoi Foundation for research grants supporting our Compassion Studies Initiative (2025) and Engaged Anekāntavāda studies (2026).

Looking ahead, our first MA-EJS student, Chellamuthu Rajamani, will graduate in May 2026 — a proud milestone for our young institution. Guided by the conviction that knowledge must serve compassion and ethical living, we will continue to grow through our 4th Annual Earth Day Conference, the inaugural Graduate Student Colloquium, and the steady expansion of all our academic initiatives including our forthcoming Center for South Asian Languages. We are methodically fulfilling our mission of democratizing Jain Studies globally. Thank you!

ABOUT ARIHANTA INSTITUTE

Arihanta Institute is a 501(c)(3) academic nonprofit dedicated to advancing the study and application of Jain philosophy, history, culture, and languages through rigorous, accessible online education. Guided by the foundational Jain values of non-violence (*ahiṃsā*) and compassion (*karuṇā*), Arihanta Institute bridges ancient wisdom with contemporary life through university-level courses, scholarly research, publications, and global academic programming.

In 2025, Arihanta Institute continued to expand its academic footprint through the fully online Master of Arts in Engaged Jain Studies (MA-EJS), offered by Claremont School of Theology, where Arihanta Institute faculty serve as Affiliated Faculty and teach accredited graduate seminars. During this period, Arihanta Institute further advanced its global leadership in Engaged Jain Studies by strengthening graduate-level language instruction, expanding research-driven curricula, and supporting a growing international student community.

Throughout 2025, Arihanta Institute advanced its three core academic initiatives: the Vegan Studies Initiative (VSI), the Compassion Studies Initiative (CSI), and the Center for the Study of Jain Yoga (CSJY). These initiatives broadened interdisciplinary scholarship at the intersection of Jain thought, ethics, ecology, animal advocacy, yoga, and lived non-violence through new courses, public lectures, conferences, and collaborative academic programming.

While not a religious organization, Arihanta Institute connects learners worldwide with the intellectual and ethical traditions rooted in the teachings of the tīrthaṅkaras, including Mahāvīra, fostering critical inquiry alongside contemplative and applied learning. Through its expanding academic ecosystem, Arihanta Institute continues to empower students, scholars, and practitioners to apply Jain principles toward personal transformation and constructive engagement with the ethical and social challenges of the modern world.

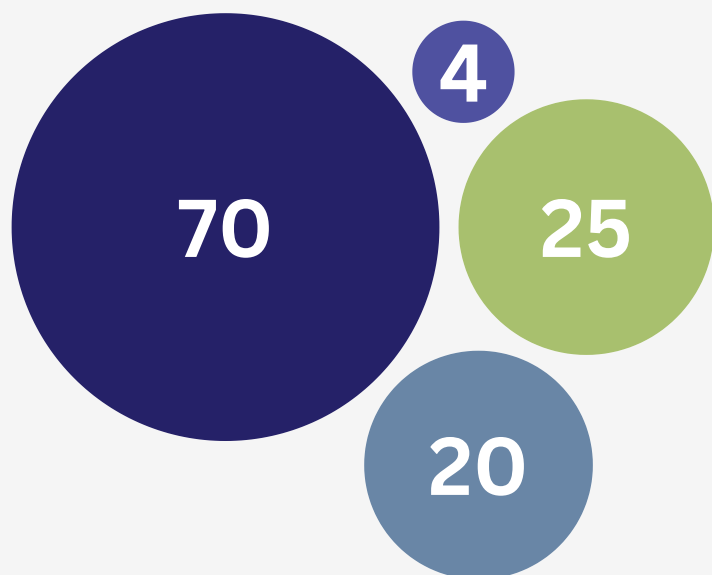

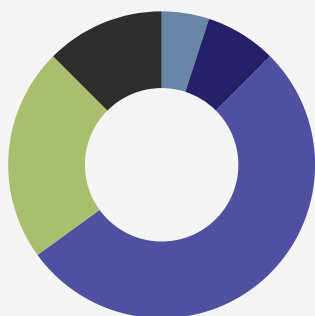

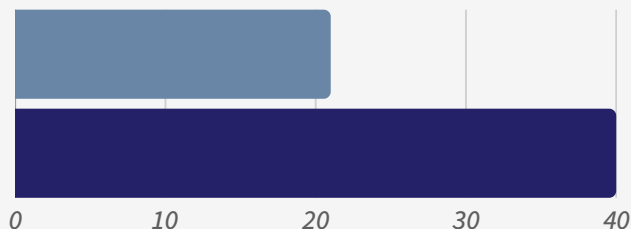

LETTER FROM THE VP OF ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Dear Colleagues and Friends,

2025 was a troubling and difficult year for many around the world, marked by routine violence on human and non-human animals and the environment. As those involved in Engaged Jain Studies know, these issues are intimately intertwined and their resolution requires careful interdisciplinary understanding of the mechanisms of power and knowledge production that enable them.

In anticipation of these difficulties, we significantly expanded our *Compassion Studies Initiative* in 2025 with the support of the Uberoi Foundation. These offerings included new courses, a speaker series, podcast episodes, a "Compassion in Action" conference, and rigorous graduate-level training at our partner Claremont School of Theology (CST) - all focused on encouraging the cultivation of human compassion in global society.

In the *Vegan Studies Initiative*, we hosted new graduate seminars, certificate courses, speakers, and podcast episodes with an interdisciplinary cohort of scholars. Meanwhile, the *Center for the Study of Jain Yoga* hosted a summer conference and launched new courses to continue to bring Jain Yoga into the field of Yoga Studies globally.

Finally, our language studies also expanded significantly through both introductory graduate-level and advanced graduate-level training in Sanskrit and Gujarati, thereby giving students around the world direct access to Jain scriptural wisdom.

In the report that follows, you will find further details on our Initiatives and CST's collaborative MA in Engaged Jain Studies graduate program, as well as each of our faculty's teaching, research, and publishing achievements in 2025.

As our troubling and difficult times continue to unravel at rapid speed, we will continue to educate and encourage the core Jain principles of compassion and non-violence as society's most viable and desirable path forward. We thank you for your continued support of our educational mission.

MASTER OF ARTS IN ENGAGED JAIN STUDIES

In partnership with Arihanta Institute, Claremont School of Theology offers a first-of-its-kind, fully online MA program in Engaged Jain Studies that equips students—Jains and non-Jains alike to apply Jain philosophy and ethics to real-world challenges. Grounded in rigorous scholarship and taught by global experts, the program emphasizes the integration of Jain values—*ahimsā* (non-violence), *aparigraha* (non-possession), and *anekāntavāda* (non-one-sidedness)—into daily personal, professional, and social life.

With comprehensive coursework in Jain philosophy, ethics, anthropology, and interreligious studies—including yoga and other dharma traditions—students explore how timeless Jain principles can guide responses to contemporary issues such as environmental degradation, animal rights, and business ethics. Through community engagement and applied learning, graduates are empowered to become agents of compassionate, values-driven change.

2025 saw the program continue to grow in both enrollment and scholarly depth — a momentum that carried into February 2026, when the program convened its first Graduate Student Colloquium, a milestone gathering that showcased the intellectual rigor and community the program has cultivated. 2026 will mark another historic moment: the graduation of the program's first MA candidate, a testament to the vision and persistence of everyone who helped bring this pioneering program to life.

"I have completed my first year in the Master of Arts in Engaged Jain Studies program and it has been remarkably transformative. I chose this program to delve into South Asian religions while enhancing my language skills. The courses on Jainism are fantastic and multifaceted. Jain Yoga and Research Sanskrit courses were particularly enriching, offering deep insights into the spiritual and philosophical dimensions of Jainism. VEGAN STUDIES INITIATIVE (VSI)

2025 marked VSI's first full calendar year of programming — four new online courses and eight podcast episodes that laid the intellectual groundwork for the field.

- "Animal Sanctuary: Solutions in Nonviolence" (Jonina Turzi, co-founder of Lancaster Farm Sanctuary) examined farm animal sanctuaries as both ethical practice and political intervention.
- "Veganism & Pop Culture" (Christopher Sebastian) explored how media shapes moral sensibilities around animals and veganism.
- "Foundations of Animal Ethics" (Jishnu Guha-Majumdar, PhD) tackled a deceptively simple question: why is the way humans treat animals morally wrong?
- "Gender, Animals, and Veganism" (Laura Wright, PhD, who coined the term "Vegan Studies") brought an intersectional lens to the field, challenging stereotypes of veganism as white, elitist, and feminized while examining how gender, power, and embodiment entangle human and animal oppression.

CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF JAIN YOGA (CSJY)

2025 was a year of deep scholarship and community gathering for the CSJY — six courses spanning ancient texts, living languages, and contemplative practice, alongside a landmark conference.

- "Light on the Dark Age of Jain Yoga" (Corinna May Lhoir) illuminated an understudied chapter in the history of Jain contemplative traditions.
- "Yogabindu and Yogadṛṣṭisamuccaya: The Yogas of Haribhadrasūri" (Christopher Jain Miller, PhD) guided students through two seminal texts by two significant teachers of early Śvetāmbara Jain yoga.
- "Samayasāra and Jñānārṇava: The Yogas of Kundakunda and Śubhacandra" (Christopher Jain Miller, PhD) explored two foundational Jain texts and their insights into inner transformation.
- "University Sanskrit 2 Live" and "Sanskrit 3: Translation and Reading of Jain Sanskrit Texts" (Cogen Bohanec, MA, PhD) continued CSJY's commitment to building primary-source literacy in classical Sanskrit.
- "Foundations of Jain Yoga Studies" (Christopher Jain Miller, PhD) grounded graduate students in the history, philosophy, and methodologies of Yoga Studies through the lens of Jain yoga's dialogue with other traditions across time.
- The 2025 Yoga Darśana Yoga Sādhana Conference at Arihanta Institute drew more than 400 registrations, reflecting the growing scholarly and practitioner interest in Jain yoga as a living tradition.

COMPASSION STUDIES INITIATIVE (CSI)

2025 was a landmark year for the Compassion Studies Initiative, made possible in part by a grant from the Uberoi Foundation — with ten courses launched, 340+ registrants at the 3rd Annual Engaged Jain Studies Conference: "Compassion-in-Action," and nine free public sessions through the Voices in Compassion Studies speaker series, together demonstrating the breadth and momentum of compassion as a field of serious study.

- "Jain Teachings & Practices of Compassion" (Jeffery D. Long, PhD), "Buddhism, (Non)Action & Compassionate Responsibility" (Anna Halafoff), "Sikh Teachings & Practices of Compassion" (D.P. Singh, PhD), and "Devotional (Bhakti) Approaches to Compassion" (Eileen Goddard) grounded the initiative across four rich contemplative traditions.
- "Compassionate Food Systems for Planetary Healing" (Sailesh Rao, PhD) and "Human Security as Compassion: Jain Perspectives on Global Challenges" (Melanie Barbato, PhD) extended compassion ethics into urgent global questions.
- "Forgiveness as Compassion" (Venu Mehta, PhD), "Spiritual Approaches to Cultivating Compassion" (Frank Rogers, PhD), and "Interreligious Approaches to Compassion in Action" (Nitin Shah, MD) explored compassion as both personal practice and interreligious dialogue.

“In 2025, my work comprised an integrated program of graduate teaching, research, public scholarship, and academic service in direct support of Arihanta Institute’s mission and long-term strategic goals. I taught three graduate-level research-language courses totaling 135 contact hours across Sanskrit and Gujarati, completing the foundational two-semester Sanskrit sequence and introducing two new graduate offerings—Advanced Research Sanskrit and Research Gujarati—thereby expanding Arihanta’s curriculum into advanced and underrepresented research languages. In research, I advanced four major academic book projects, including two edited volumes now under contract and in production for 2026 and two monographs in active development, while completing nine peer-reviewed journal articles and book chapters accepted and placed into production with leading academic presses and journals. In addition, I authored twelve non-academic public scholarship pieces for Arihanta Institute, delivered six peer-facing academic conference presentations, participated in nine structured public education sessions, delivered four additional invited public lectures, appeared on four podcast episodes, and completed eight formal peer-review and research-assessment activities, including journal manuscript reviews and an international grant review. Collectively, these activities reflect a sustained, verifiable body of work centered on language-based scholarship, Jain and dharma studies, ethical inquiry, and public-facing intellectual leadership, contributing directly to Arihanta Institute’s curricular growth, academic credibility, and public impact.”

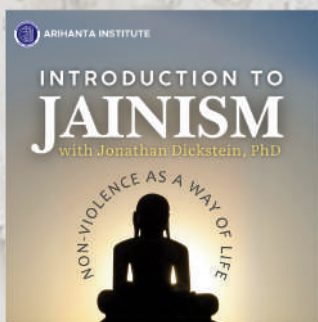
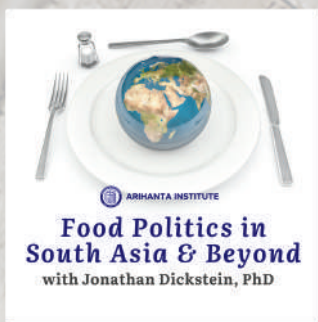

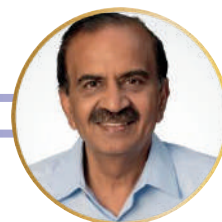
